

European Data Privacy Law (GDPR)

- Implemented May 25, 2018
- No data breach required
- 432 fines already imposed, mainly for collecting personal data for marketing exceeding 220 million euros
 - Google 50 million euros (\$57 USD, \$77 CAD)
 - H&M Henner & Mauritz 35.2 million euros
 - TIM (Telecom) 27.8 million euros
 - British Airways 21.9 million euros
 - Marriott International 20.45 million euros








The Shrinking Middle Class

Median incomes of households, by income tier, in 2016 dollars and scaled to reflect a three-person household







 - When tested on previously unseen cases, the AI could diagnose glandular fever (also known as mononucleosis), roseola, influenza, chicken pox and hand-foot-mouth disease with between 90 and 97 per cent accuracy.

 - In an objective evaluation in which researchers were given slides of lymph node cells and asked to determine whether or not they contained cancer, the team's automated diagnostic method proved accurate approximately 92 percent of the time, explained Khosla, adding, "This nearly matched the success rate of a human pathologist, whose results were 96 percent accurate."
 - "But the truly exciting thing was when we combined the pathologist's analysis with our automated computational diagnostic method, the result improved to 99.5 percent accuracy," said Beck. "Combining these two methods yielded a major reduction in errors."

 - In the first major example, the French data protection authority announced Monday that it had fined Google 50 million euros, or about \$57 million, for not properly disclosing to users how data is collected across its services including its search engine, Google Maps and YouTube to present personalized advertisements.

 - 91 Fines Already Under European Data Privacy Law
 - First, it's important to remember that regulators can take action whether or not a data breach has occurred, as evidenced by the €50 million fine imposed by the CNIL not for a data breach but relating to the processing of personal data for advertising purposes without first obtaining consent.
 - Moreover, a data breach is not necessarily a breach of GDPR. A recent airline breach in the UK is a good example—the company was hacked and suffered a breach that thus far has not been found to be a violation of GDPR. However, an organization that is in breach of data protection laws can be penalized, even if sensitive data has not been leaked or fallen into the wrong hands.



Venezuela: annexation of private property

 - 1998 Hugo Chavez elected president amid disenchantment with established parties, launches 'Bolivarian Revolution' that brings in new constitution, socialist and populist economic, and social policies funded by high oil prices, alongside increasingly anti-US foreign policy.
 - 2001 President Chavez uses enabling act to pass laws aimed at redistributing land and wealth. Concern grows in business and some labour circles that he is trying to concentrate economic and political power.
 - 2005 January President Chavez signs decree on land reform to eliminate Venezuela's large estates and benefit rural poor. Ranchers say move is attack on private property.
 - 2005 March New media regulations provide stiff fines and prison terms for slandering public figures.
 - 2007 January President Chavez announces key energy and telecommunications companies will be nationalised under 18-month enabling act approved by parliament.
 - 2007 June Two leading US oil companies, Exxon Mobil and ConocoPhilips, refuse to hand over majority control of their operations in the Orinoco Belt to the Venezuelan government, which then expropriates them.
 - 2007 December President Chavez suffers his first defeat at the ballot box, when a referendum narrowly rejects proposals to increase government control over the Central Bank and the power to expropriate property.
 - 2010 January President Chavez devalues the bolivar currency to boost revenue from oil exports after economy shrank 5.8% in last quarter of 2009.
 - 2012 April Government extends price controls on more basic goods in the battle against inflation. President Chavez threatens to expropriate companies that do not comply with the price controls.
 - 2013 April President Hugo Chavez dies at age 58 in March after a battle with cancer. Nicolas Maduro, his chosen successor, is elected president by a narrow margin. The opposition contests the result.



Battle Between Google and China

 - The Intercept reported that the company was working on a secret prototype of a new, censored Chinese search engine, called Project Dragonfly. Amid a furor from human rights activists and some Google employees, US Vice President Mike Pence called on the company to kill Dragonfly, saying it would "strengthen Communist Party censorship and compromise the privacy of Chinese customers." In mid-December, The Intercept reported that Google had suspended its development efforts in response to complaints from the company's own privacy team, who learned about the project from the investigative website's reporting.
 - By late 2009, Google controlled more than a third of the Chinese search market—a respectable share but well below Baidu's 58%, according to data from Analysys International.
 - On January 12, 2010, Google announced, "We have decided we are no longer willing to continue censoring our results on Google.cn, and so over the next few weeks we will be discussing with the Chinese government the basis on which we could operate an unfiltered search engine within the law, if at all."
 - But officials refused to cede ground. "China welcomes international Internet businesses developing services in China according to the law," a foreign ministry spokeswoman told Reuters at the time. Government control of information was—and remains—central to Chinese Communist Party doctrine. Six months earlier, following riots in Xinjiang, the government had blocked Facebook, Twitter, and Google's YouTube in one fell swoop, fortifying the "Great Firewall." The government was making a bet: China and its technology sector did not need Google search to succeed.

 - Technology Has Already Taken Over 90% Of The Jobs Humans Used To Do
 - One hundred years ago, the vast majority of people in the world worked on farms. The invention and proliferation of technology has made it possible so that a small minority of farmers (2% here in America) can provide food for all.
 - A little over one hundred years ago, there were millions of jobs related to the main mode of local transportation of the day: the horse-drawn carriage. All of those jobs building carriages, manufacturing buggy whips, raising horses and scooping up their excrement off the city streets. Again, progress and technology have all but eliminated those jobs, and here we are.
 - Seventy years ago, a little over 3% of the U.S. workforce was employed by the railroad industry moving freight and passengers around the country. Today, only 0.1% of the workforce is involved in the railroad industry, yet it moves nearly three times the amount of freight around the country [1].
 - As described in the movie Hidden Figures, NASA used to employ human computers to calculate flight trajectories that helped get our spaceships into the sky. Today the aggregate computing power of human computing from that era is dwarfed by the device sitting in your pocket.

 - Analysts predict that by 2020, one-fifth of the multitrillion-dollar U.S. retail market will have shifted to the web and that Amazon alone will reap two-thirds of that bounty.
 - Thanks to automation and a killer business model, Amazon is so efficient that it reaps nearly twice the revenue per employee of Walmart, despite the fact that Walmart, too, has a substantial online presence. Worldwide, Amazon has installed over 100,000 robots to labor in "perfect symbiosis" with humans in its warehouses and has plans to install many thousands more. While it's not clear what constitutes perfect symbiosis, the robots are said to save the company \$22 million annually, per warehouse. The company's master plan of an autonomous future also includes goods delivered by drones and self-driving vehicles.
 - For while Amazon continues to open warehouses around the globe and staff them with many thousands of human beings, estimates
 are that every human on the Amazon payroll—whether full- or part-time—displaces two humans at traditional brick-and-mortar
 operations.
 - Every minute of every day, Google services 3.6 million searches in the United States alone. Spammers send 100 million emails.
 Snapchatters send 527,000 photos, and the Weather Channel broadcasts 18 million forecasts.
 - Small, specialty stores also have far more flexibility than large department stores. "Technology has reduced the cost of entry into new
 markets, so in retail there are fewer big, monolithic companies, but more small competitors," he says. "Companies are diversifying to
 meet the specific needs and desires of consumers—everyone's piece is getting smaller, but there are many more pieces."
 - Technology has engendered a two-tiered retail landscape—with more high-end boutique-type stores appealing mostly to high-wage earners, and many more discount stores appealing to price-sensitive customers. "More than 1,000 discount stores opened in the U.S. this year alone, as did a large number of what we call 'premier' high-end niche stores," Lobaugh says. What's declining is what marketers call the "balanced" store—department stores and other retailers that balance quality and price for mid-market customers.

"Between 2007 and 2017, income gains—an average increase of \$50,000 in household income—went mostly to the top 20 percent of earners," Lobaugh explains. "In fact, this group gained more than 100 percent of the increase, because the bottom 40 percent actually lost ground. The middle 40 percent gained \$10,000 per household. But their expenses increased—food, housing, transportation. Health care skyrocketed. On top of that came digital necessities—things like cellphones and data plans. That leaves most people very little money to spend on retail, which means they have become very, very price sensitive."
